Legal-Aid 101

What is repression?

During a political action it is often the police or other state forces that try to stop and undermine or prevent leftist activism. Typical forms of repression include stopping people on the way to the action, dissolving assemblies or demonstrations, harassing activists, police brutality or taking people into custody. It's part of our solidarity that we protect ourselves and others from this repression and set up structures to help with this.

We stand in solidarity! No one is left alone!

The most important things at a glance:

:If you are arrested:

1. Stay calm
2. Don't talk to the police, don't confess to anything, don't sign any papers, object to anything the police wants to do
3. You have the right to a phone call. Use it to call the EA!
4. After you have been released: Check in with your affinity group or buddy and discuss how you are feeling after the arrest.

What do I say to the EA:

1. Were you are being detained
2. What you are being accused of
3. How long the police wants to keep you in custody
4. **Not!** what you or other people did or did not do.

EA NUMMER: _____

If you are taken into police custody (GeSa):

- You can be taken into custody as a preventative measure to prevent future crimes or to ensure that you don't enter a certain area ("platzverweis")
- Normally max. until the next evening, a court decision could extend this
- Contact the EA (see frontpage)
- Don't talk to the police about the action, about other people & try and destroy your SIM-Card
- You only have to give the police the info on your ID-Card
- Don't sign anything
- You don't have to cooperate with a ID-Treatment (Fingerprints, Pictures, etc.)
- Ask for a receipt for anything the cops confiscate
